Financial Issues:

The Treasurer presented the FY 2026 Q2 Quarterly Financial report to the Commission and the public. The ANC 4E FY 2026 Quarter 2 Quarterly Financial Report (January-March 2026) was approved 4-0.



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Community Matters

DDOT's Georgia Avenue NW Bus Priority Project Manager

Matthew Gaskin of DDOT was not present. Dallas Thompson from WMATA noted the upcoming community meeting next Thursday at 6 pm at Milk Crate on 14th St. and shared the registration link. Mr. Thompson noted that WMATA can't respond to the ANC 4E resolution because it is directed to DDOT.

MPD 4D Update

Newly-appointed 4D Commander David Hong was invited to attend to introduce himself to the community but was unexpectedly caught at a scene and was unable to attend.

DC 2050 Comprehensive Plan

Nick Kushner and Matthew Jesick of the D.C. Office of Planning (OP) joined to provide an overview of the new Comprehensive Plan that is under development. Commissioner McAdams noted that this is the beginning of ANC 4E's engagement and that as a commission we are not bound by the upcoming deadline for public comment on the draft Future Land Use Map (FLUM).

Mr. Kushner explained that DC2050 is the long-range vision for DC and that it feeds into agency budgets. The process is still in the public engagement phase, and they will soon be wrapping up taking public comments on the FLUM. He walked through the remaining phases of the process, and noted that even once adopted, the new FLUM does not automatically result in zoning changes; this requires a separate process.

OP is working with the Office of ANCs (OANC) to develop a process for engaging ANCs at the outset of Phase 3.

Nick Kushner and Matthew Jesick entertained questions from commissioners and the public. Commissioner McAdams encouraged residents to complete OP's online survey to submit comments.

Commissioner Micone joined the meeting during this discussion.



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Regulatory Items

Application for a Retailer's Class "C" Tavern Liquor License for KVIC Restaurant Bar at 4900 Georgia Avenue NW (4E04)

Commissioner Gordon introduced applicant Victor Carranza, who is requesting a tavern license. On weekends he plans for the facility to function as a disco/nightclub. The applicant agreed to work with Commissioner Gordon on a voluntary agreement prior to the May 18 status hearing, in which case ANC 4E will withdraw its protest.

Resolution Regarding Temporary Suspension of Street Sweeping in Construction Project Zones Until Completion (Various SMDs)

The commission is reupping a resolution it adopted last year to ensure it continues to get great weight, as we want the suspension to remain in place until construction is complete. The new resolution has no end date, which means sweeping could resume in certain blocks when construction complete; we are asking for two weeks notice. Approved 5-0.

Trash Receptacle at Georgia Avenue and Buchanan Street NW (4E04)

Commissioner Gordon noted that people are putting residential trash in this receptacle and it piles up. There are similar problems with other trash cans in the area. DPW strategy has been to remove cans when this happens. Commissioner Gordon moved for a resolution to request that DPW remove this receptacle and move it to Upshur Park, where Commissioner McAdams noted one is needed. Approved 5-0.

D.C. Government Updates

Office of Ward 4 Councilmember Janeese Lewis George (Barbara Rogers)

The Council received the FY27 budget from the Mayor last month, which started the Council budget review process. Oversight hearings are continuing, and Councilmember Lewis George wants the community to come and advocate for Ward 4 priorities.

Constituent service pop-ups are ongoing; the Councilmember's staff go to areas where there have been complaints or requests for government resources.

Councilmember Lewis George is fighting PEPCO on recent rate increases.

Ward 4 constituent services office hours take place every Wednesday at Fort Stevens Rec Center from 12 to 1pm, followed by office hours at Hattie Holmes Senior Wellness Center from 1:30 to 2:30. Community members can stop by and speak one-on-one with a member of their team about city resources, constituent services concerns, or their work in the Ward 4 community.



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Public Comment

Theresa DuBois from EventsDC shared information about upcoming events and community grant opportunities.

Uptown Main Street noted music on the plaza May 14 and Porchfest May 30.

Mr. Uqdah thanked Councilmember Lewis George for introducing Bill #26-0669 — the braid exemption bill, and asked Commissioner Jones about relocation of the capital bikeshare station and trash can on the plaza at 14th and Kennedy.
